**Council News:**

Our appreciation to Brother Peter Horsfield and his wife Patte for hosting a successful 'Christmas in July' at their home on July 25th.

The initial KofC Choir met on Aug. 12th and Br. G. Taylor was pleased with the turn-out. The Choir expects to meet every Wednesday at 1900 Hrs at the Church.

Br. G. Johnston continues to strive forward as Chair of the Ascension Building Renovation Programme. Fund raising efforts have reached \$200,000 with pledges from approximately 18% of parishioners. A total of \$500,000 will be required to meet the project needs. Complete plans and updates are available at the church Hall.

**The World Around Us:**

The 127th Annual KofC Supreme Convention was held in Phoenix, Ariz. Delegates passed a resolution on 'Defending the Right to Life', reaffirming the Knights' "unconditional support for the right of life and full protection in law for every human being from conception to natural death." 'Support for Marriage' was another resolution endorsed at the Convention. The Knights promised to never waver in their support for marriage as the "exclusive and lifelong union of one man and one woman joined in an intimate partnership of life and love."

Current discussions on the idea of a Health Care System in the USA continues at every level. Archbishop T. Dolan of New York told CNA that the Catholic Church will have no part in a health care programme that destroys life. Explaining that "if health care begins to lead to the 'destruction of human life' through avenues such as abortion, end of life care, or the discarding human embryos, then 'we say it's no longer health care at all'. (CNA Aug 6)

The KofC Convention also adopted a resolution to condemn the pornography industry which is said to "saturate..modern society" with sexually explicit and violent content in films and TV, video games and 'especially' the Internet, citing the 4 million websites, approximately 35% of the Net's content, dedicated to porn. The porn industry is currently worth US\$12 Billion per year, is linked to organized crime and a major contributor to societal disintegration, infidelity, broken marriages, harm to children and "a general breakdown of moral standards." (catholic.org Aug 11)

Supreme Knight C. Anderson stated that KofC everywhere mourn the passing of Eunice Kennedy-Shriver. Among the many contributions to society her greatest legacy is the creation of the Special Olympics. KofC has supported and been involved with Special Olympics for the last 40 years when Ms. Kennedy and her husband, KofC Brother Sargent Shriver, held the first Olympic games in Chicago.

The KofC held the first international Marian Congress on our Lady of Guadalupe from Aug 6-8th, 09'

The tilma(cloak) of St. Juan Diego is imprinted with the image of the Blessed Mother. A thumb sized portion of that tilma was featured at the 127th KofC Convention at Phoenix, Ariz. as well as at the Marian Congress on Guadalupe Festival. (KofC.org.)

It has been reported that across the USA, hundreds of College graduates are opting to spend their first year out of school doing community service in response to the tight job market. The Jesuit Volunteer Corps Northwest which places volunteers in Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington, has seen a 40% increase in numbers from the previous year.. (CNS Aug 11)

Pope Benedict XVI has publicly deplored the killing of 8 Christians in Pakistan by a Muslim mob. That country has experienced numerous anti-Christian incidents in recent months. (CNS Aug 3)

BBC Aug 6/ report; Those close to the 265th Pope describe him as a "razor sharp, intelligent man and a good listener" They also claim that he is a far cry from his caricature media image "a modest and gentle pastor with a simple faith'.

Pope Benedict XVI will be featured in a new CD singing and reciting Marian hymns and prayers "Alma Mater" (Latin for Nourishing Mother), will be released worldwide on November 30, 09' by Geffen Records. (CNS Aug 3)

August 15th - Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In England and Wales, this event is celebrated on the nearest Sunday if it falls on a Saturday or Monday (BBC/UK Aug3)

CNS Aug 5; Pope Benedict XVI and Pres. B. Obama along with several heads of state including Canada, Mexico, Poland and the Phillipines, sent greetings along with words of appreciation and encouragement to the KofC Convention at Phoenix, Ariz.

#### SHOP & CHAT??

A CNS Aug 5 report indicates statistics reveal decreasing numbers of Catholics participating in the sacrament of reconciliation or do so less than once a year. The Diocese of Colorado Springs, Colo. via the Capuchin Franciscans has decided to make more direct contact with 'the fallen' at the Citadel Mall in that city. The 'Catholic Center' offers Mass and the sacrament at the Mall and is financially supported and promoted by the Diocese of Colorado Springs, the Capuchin Province of Mid-America and the Knights of Columbus. Since opening in 2001 the Catholic Center has seen 16,000 people attending the 12.10 pm Mass and 72,000 attending the 6 p.m. Mass. The KofC provide security for the priests and participants throughout the day and night.

#### BBC NEWS Aug 2; 'OOPS!'

A Roman Catholic Bank in Germany has apologized after admitting it bought stocks in defence, tobacco and birth control companies. Der Spiegel newspaper reported the Bank had invested 580,000 euros (\$826,674) in a British arms Co. (BAE Systems). It had also invested 160,000 euros in Wyeth the US birth control pill maker and 870,000 euros in tobacco companies. The bank apologized for behaviour "not in keeping with ethical standards".

CNS July 25' X.Rays show Pope Benedict XVI's right wrist which he broke in a fall on July 17 is healing well.

July 28 (CNS); Pope Benedict XVI's piano has been tuned and is ready for his return. However, until his wrist injury has completely healed, he will not be able to play.

CNS July 28; Pope Benedict XVI confirmed his intention to visit the Shroud of Turin when it goes on public display in Turin's cathedral April 10-May 23, 2010. The shroud underwent major cleaning and restoration in 2002. A recent study by French scientist Thierry Castex revealed that traces of words in Aramaic spelling and Hebrew letters have been found on the shroud.

Barbara Frale, a Vatican researcher claims her own studies suggest the letters on the shroud were written more than 1,800 years ago. She said that in 78', a Latin professor in Milan noticed Aramaic writing on the shroud and in 89' scholars discovered Hebrew characters that probably were portions of the phrase "The King of the Jews"

CNS July 22; Vietnamese Police beat hundreds of Catholics seeking to restore a parish. Hundreds of Catholics who were erecting a cross and building an altar on the ground of a church at Tam Toa, Diocese of Vinh, that collapsed during the Vietnam War were reportedly brutally beaten by the Police. Dozens of Catholics were arrested in the clash.

This is a historic parish for Vietnamese Catholics and can trace its origin back to 1631. The parish was very active in the 1600's as the largest parish in the region. It once had an orphanage and school operated by the Sisters of the Lovers of the Holy Cross. In 1886, a group of anti-Western men attacked the parish, killing 52 parishioners. The church was largely destroyed in 1968 during a US Air Force bombing raid.

Swine flu fears affect the Church of England. Some Anglican churches now permit dipping the bread in communion rather than sharing the chalice. In certain dioceses a hug rather than a hand shake as a 'sign of peace' is now encouraged and using shared holy water stoups is being discouraged.(FT 22/7)

How a Church Choir became a Concert Choir. (Story provided by one of its members.)

The Good Sheppard Church which is the main church of Star of the Sea Parish in South Surrey, BC has a concert choir consisting of approximately 40 members known as the `Stella Maris Choir`, (`Star of the Sea`) formerly known as the `Star of the Sea Jubilee Choir`.

The Choir was originally a church choir for the Sunday 11.00 AM Mass but has become a Concert Choir over the past 6 years. The choir sings mostly SATB pieces, four part harmony(Soprano, Alto, Tenor and Bass) Some pieces have three parts Soprano- first, second and descant. Most church or youth choirs sing only melody, (one part) Church song books are written only in melody. Most men`s choirs sing Tenor, Baritone and Bass, women`s choirs will do up to 5 parts in Soprano and Alto. The `Stella Maris Choir` music is mainly liturgical however includes gospel, classical and modern with pieces sung in English, Latin, Spanish, French, German, Swahili and some in Hebrew. The Church has very good acoustics and is often used by other professional choirs. The `Stella Maris Choir` also holds concerts at other churches and schools in the Lower Mainland and small theatres including the Chandris-Pattison Theatre and recently held a concert at a funeral home with a Jewish choir. During this past summer they sang at a Mass held under a tent at the Catholic Cemetery in South Surrey officiated by Archbishop Miller before more than 500 people.

Some 27 members of the Choir, including the pianist and Director travelled to Germany this summer to hold six planned concerts at churches in Pulheim and Rondorf (suburbs of Cologne), the Cathedral at Trier and music festivals in Kussel, Mutterstadt and Hahnheim. They were also asked to sing in Aachen, Speyer, Strasbourg(France) and twice at a castle near Koblenz. The choir toured by bus to the various concerts and some side trips and were billeted with families in Pulheim, Kussel, Mutterstadt and Hahnheim. The hosts also belonged to various choirs and most of them were Catholics. The invitation to the festival in Kussel was put on by the Lutheran church. Numerous spouses accompanied the 27 choir members and the group made many new friends in Germany and served to strengthen bonds between choir members.

Rome(Reuters 28/6)Pope Benedict XVI announced that fragments of bone from the 1st and 2nd century had been found in a tomb in the Basilica of St. Paul in Rome which may confirm the belief that it housed the apostle`s remains.

Paul was converted on the road to Damascus following a vision of Jesus and took the Gospel to pagan Greeks and Romans. He met his martyrdom approx. 65 AD.

It was traditionally thought that St. Paul was buried together with St. Peter in a catacomb on the Via Appia in Rome and was later moved to the basilica erected in his honour. In 2006, a stone sarcophagus was discovered which has been examined by Vatican archeologists . Through a small opening the interior of the sarcophagus the found `traces of a precious purple linen cloth laminated with gold and a blue coloured textile with filaments of linen. Carbon 14 testing indicated the tiny bone fragments belonged to someone who lived in the 1st or 2nd century.
